






- Rural, remote, isolated region with harsh winters




# Snowmobiles are Integral

- Snowmobiles are an integral part of transportation as well as recreation



# Winter Tragedies

- loss of life (Burton Winters is well known in the country)
- major injuries (femurs of 2 teens this past winter in Goose Bay alone)



# Labrador-Grenfell Health Region

Stats reporting years 2005-2012:

- Highest hospitalization rate of all four health authorities in the province
- More males hospitalized
- Highest rates were among 16-19 and 20-29 age groups



- Four 'Scenes'




# Scenes



# Break-Down




- Have been drinking

- Community – the local CBC radio show did a story about the maze & Town Councilors attended from HVGB




# Partnerships - One Maze

- The maze does not work well without partnerships!
- One maze workshop alone needs at least 5 people for it to run smoothly, optimally there would be 9 people (two at each station and a time keeper)
- RCMP, Public Health Nurses, Community Groups, Junior Rangers, Dept of Forestry and Wildlife, etc.
